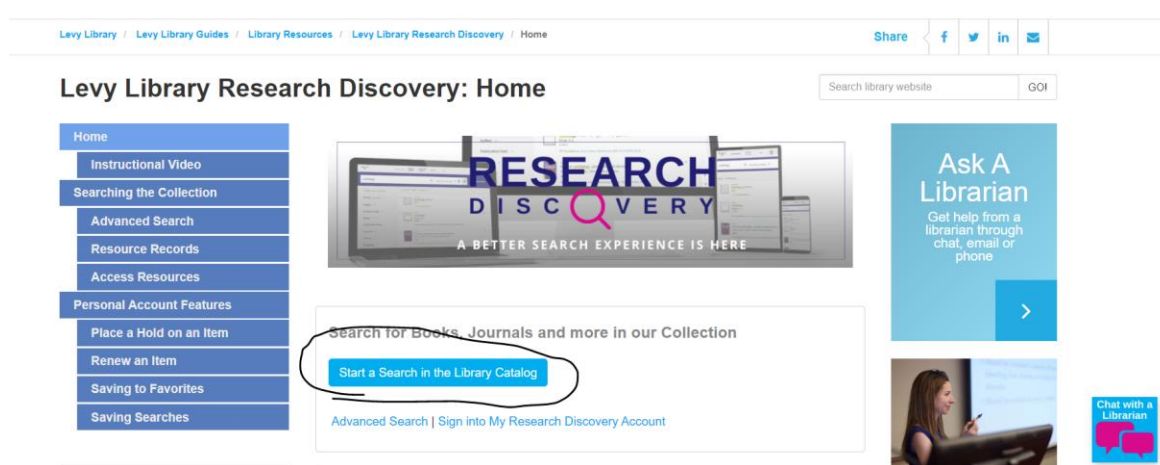
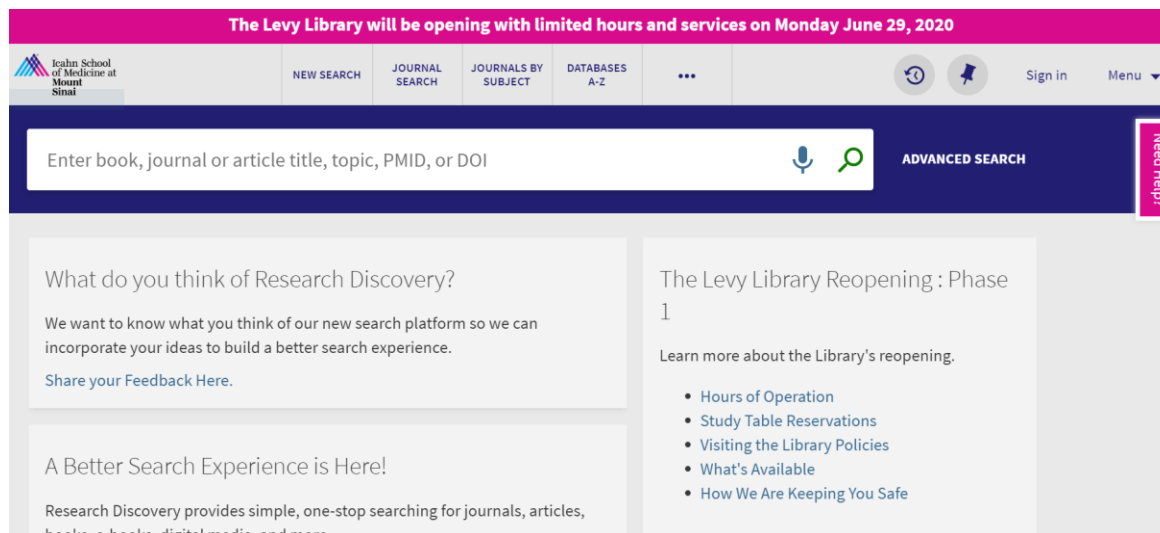


Using the Levy Library Catalog to find an E-Book:

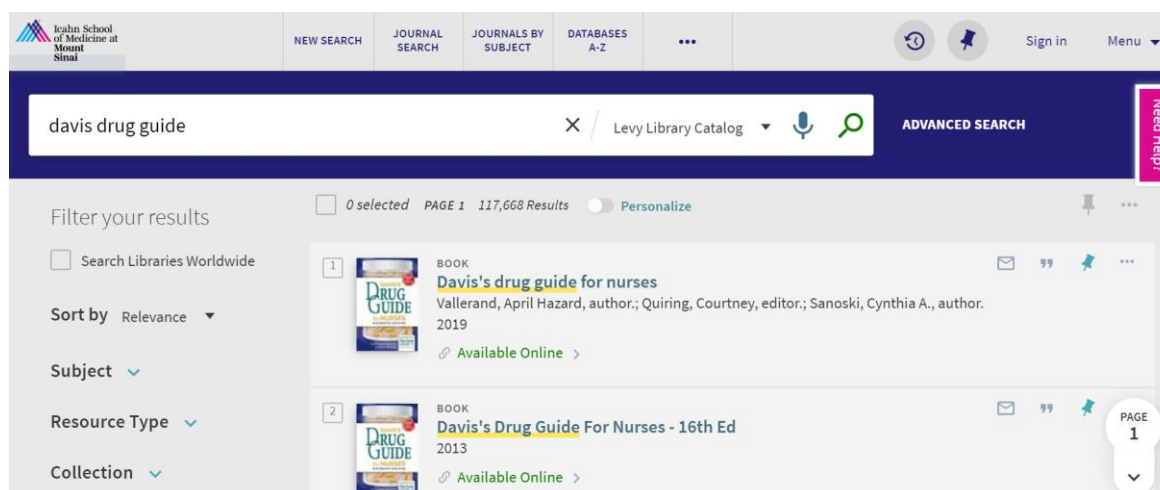
Go to <https://libguides.mssm.edu/Discovery> and select “Start a Search in the Library Catalog.”



Select “New Search” and type in what you are looking for. Example: Davis Drug Guide or Pathophysiology...



Sort by the filters if you need to for online availability, date, author, or year...Select the book title or click “Available Online.”



Go to Full Text Availability. For this eBook, it is on Stat! Ref. Click on Stat! Ref.
